The Corrugated Recycling Most Asked Questions

- Can I recycle cardboard with tape on it?

Most types of packing tape used to secure cardboard boxes are not recyclable, so it's important that you remove sticky tape from cardboard before recycling.

Using die cut boxes means no packing tape is necessary as die cut boxes close using a slotted system.

- How many times can cardboard be recycled?

Cardboard is built to be recycled. In fact, cardboard packaging can be recycled **5 to 7 times!**

- What percentage of cardboard actually gets recycled?

Currently, about **70 percent** of cardboard-boxes shipped commercially are recovered for recycling.
